



HeLP Legal Services Clinic

- HeLP Legal Services Clinic is a 3-hour graded course in which students work with low-income clients and practice real-world lawyering skills. Students work closely with a Supervising Attorney, a faculty member who serves as a mentor and directs student growth.
- Students in the HeLP Clinic are exposed to cases in a variety of areas of law, including:
 - o Supplemental Security Income (SSI) for Children
 - o Education
 - o Estate Planning
 - o Medicaid/PeachCare
 - o Housing Conditions
- Students in the HeLP Clinic have the opportunity to experience a variety of hands-on activities, including:
 - o Interviewing and Counseling
 - o Will Preparation
 - o Administrative Hearing Preparation
 - o Administrative Hearing Representation
 - Legal Writing in the forms of Letters, Letter Briefs, Memorandums, and Wills
- The HeLP Clinic is part of an interdisciplinary community collaboration.
 Clinic students work with medical residents and students, other health care professionals, public health students, and social work students.
- The HeLP Clinic is open to 2L students and above through normal course registration.
- Enrollment in the HeLP Clinic is limited.
- Following registration in the HeLP Clinic I class, students are required to attend a brief mandatory meeting and must sign a student intern agreement indicating that they understand and accept specific course requirements.

- Once the student intern agreement is executed, students shall not drop the class
- All HeLP clinic students must keep a minimum of seven (7) office hours per week in addition to attending regular clinic class sessions.
- The HeLP clinic holds a mandatory eight (8) hour orientation session. All enrolled students must attend this session.
- HeLP clinic students must comply with the HeLP Clinic vaccination policy,
